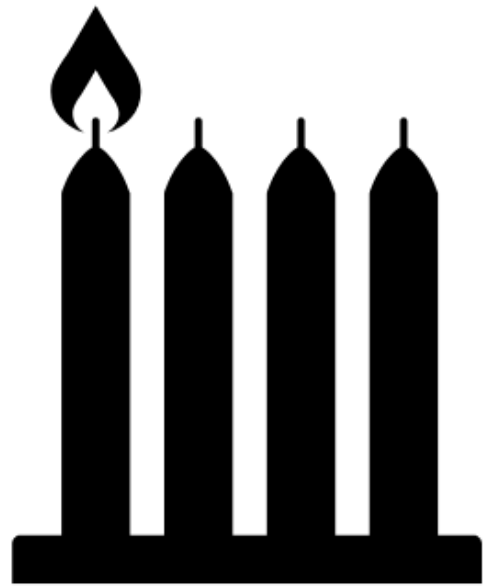

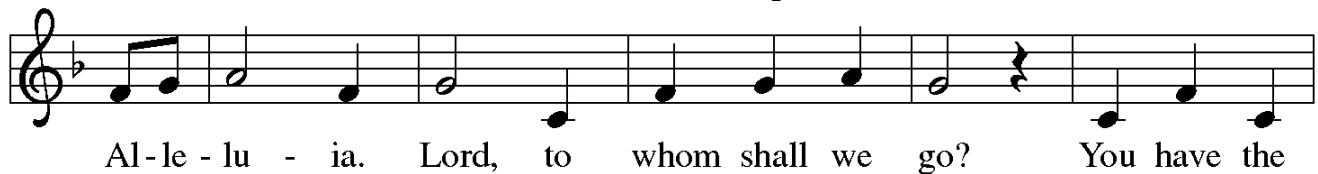

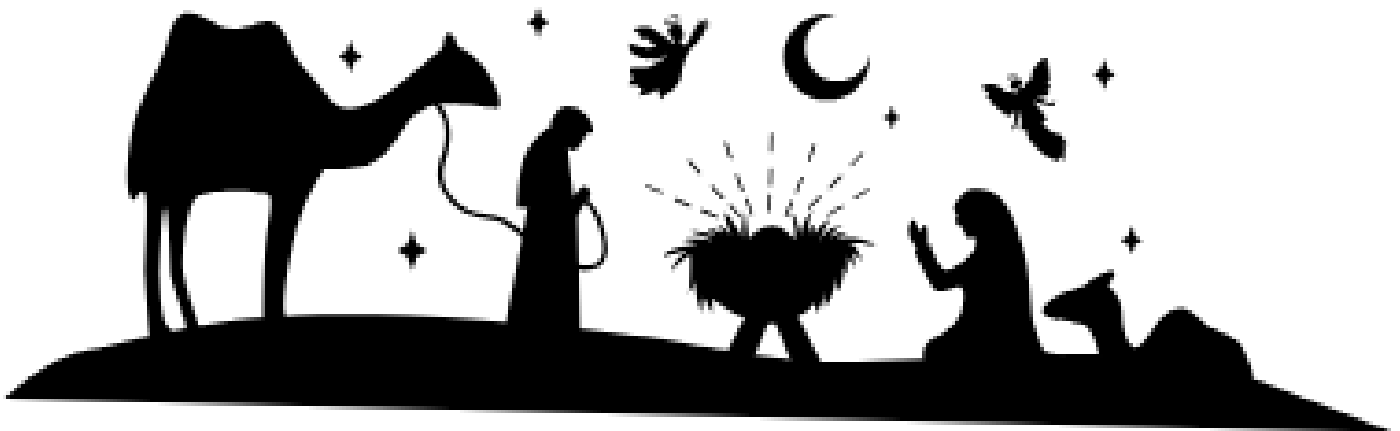
THE LORD'S PRAYER

P: Lord, remember us in your kingdom and teach us to pray.


