FROM THE PASTOR

Christmas is always a busy season around a church, and so is Lent. But if you think that means the time in between is a slower, more relaxed down-time at the church, you would be very, very, mistaken — at least around Trinity. Ash Wednesday is on March 5th, and between now and then we have a number of special emphases in worship, as well as a couple of special events that follow worship.

- January 26: Reconciling in Christ Sunday, when we lift up the unconditional welcome Trinity offers to all, regardless of their sexual orientation and gender identity.
- February 2: Baptism of Goldie Hawkinson in worship, followed by Trinity's Annual Meeting at which we will review our ministry in 2024 and look ahead to 2025.
- February 16: Scout Sunday, when we will recognize Troop 62 in worship, after which the Scouts will cook a pancake brunch for the congregation as a way of saying "Thank you" for our sponsorship of their troop. (A freewill offering for Troop 62 will be taken as folks go through the pancake line.)

February 23: Companion Synod Sunday—Kotte District of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Papua New Guinea: Trinity has been a long-time supporter of our Synod's Companion Synod program, with Jim Cooper currently serving on the Synod's Companion Synod Committee. In our worship, we will speak about what this relationship looks like, and how it is a powerful part of our synod's and congregation's understanding of what it means to be the church.

Beyond these emphases in worship and events that follow worship, there are also various other "big things" happening at the same time—though none with fixed dates attached.

- Kate Larson-Stephenson will be returning from her maternity leave, gradually resuming her duties as our Director of Congregational Life. She has been enjoying time with her newborn child, and also looking forward to what awaits her again at Trinity.
- Megan Duke has informed me and the council that after much thought and prayer, she and her family will be moving to Omaha. They have a contract on a new home there, and hope to close on the purchase on February 21. This is contingent on selling their house here in Lawrence, which has been listed for sale and had a number of showings, but no offers have yet been extended. We will take time at our Annual Meeting to thank Megan for her service at Trinity, and bless her as she enters a new chapter in her life in Omaha.
- The Call Committee has informed me that we are a step closer perhaps a big step closer to having a candidate to present to the congregation to be Trinity's next pastor. A second interview went well, and both the call committee and the candidate are looking at next steps. Either might decide to pull the plug and step away, they might decide a third interview is needed to resolve some additional questions, or they might agree that the candidate is the person they both believe God is calling to be the new pastor here. Assuming the latter is that path that is chosen, the council would need to get with the candidate to schedule a meeting with the council, a "meet and greet" with the congregation, and a special congregational meeting to vote on the call and the compensation package that would accompany it.

Like I said, there is a lot happening in the next few weeks. Stay tuned, as all the details fall into place! Peace, Pastor Peter
