+ FROM THE PASTOR +

In the world of disaster recovery efforts, there are a host of organizations who act in a host of different ways. Some are focused on the immediate aftermath, like the Federal Emergency Management Agency as well as private organizations like the Red Cross to address medical needs, and World Central Kitchen and Operation BBQ Rescue that provide meals to those who were displaced as well as first responders who need to be fed also. On their heels come those who step in as folks are beginning to recover, helping people navigate returning to their homes and rebuilding things. Some of these groups focus on the short-term, while others arrive and work with long-term service in mind.

In that last category of folks, Lutheran Disaster Response is one of the best of the bunch. They have a great reputation in the first responder community, because of their focus on partnership with local service providers and listening to the community affected, and because they are in it for the long haul (not just drop off some stuff as a PR stunt). In the world of non-profit organizations, they are held in awe because all their overhead costs are covered by the ELCA's general budget, meaning that every dollar donated to a disaster gets spent on meeting the needs of the people affected by the disaster. Nothing is taken off the top for salaries, running the office, or anything else.

After a major disaster hits, LDR puts out information about it, soliciting donations. I've taken what they wrote this week about Hurricane Helene, and added to it with my own update about Milton:

In late September, Hurricane Helene hit the coast of Florida as a Category 4 hurricane, ravaging communities in the southeast, moving south to north from Florida to Virginia. As the floodwaters have started to recede, the extreme devastation — especially in North Carolina and Tennesee -- has become clearer. Entire towns, roads, and bridges have been washed away, and millions are still without power and cell service. This past week, another Category 4 hurricane hit the Florida coast, just south of where Helene made landfall. Hurricane Milton came ashore moving in a west to east direction, wreaking destruction as it moved across the entire state and out into the Atlantic.

Whatever unfolds because of these storms, Lutheran Disaster Response will be there. LDR has strong relationships in the region and is already at work on the ground. Working alongside synods and other partners, LDR is prepared to provide support throughout the impacted region. We anticipate that our greatest impact will be reaching those in underserved and rural areas.

Gifts to Lutheran Disaster Response equip us to respond to those affected by hurricanes and related disasters, such as mudslides, severe storms, and flooding. These gifts also empower us to respond to disasters whenever and wherever they strike. Gifts to "Hurricane Response" will be used in full (100%) to assist those affected by hurricanes, until the response is complete.

If you are looking for a way to help folks hit by hurricanes, I strongly encourage you to look at LDR.
